Grants

- What are they? Money awarded to students for college that usually doesn't need to be paid back.
- Important to know: Grants might need to be repaid if your student doesn't meet certain requirements.
- **Examples:** Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG), TEACH Grants.





Scholarships

- What are they? Awards offered to students based on their academic performance, talents, or other criteria that don't need to be repaid.
- **Tip:** Encourage your child to try a variety of academic and extracurricular activities to improve scholarship opportunities.

Work-Study Jobs

- What is it? A program where students work part-time during college to earn money for school expenses.
- Benefit: Provides valuable work experience while helping cover costs.





Loans

- What are they? Borrowed money that must be repaid with interest.
- Important to know: Understand the terms and repayment plans before borrowing. Loans have different interest rates, and some will take a long time to repay if the amount is high.



Saving Options

- 1. Set a Savings Goal
- Plan ahead: Decide how much you can save based on your income.
- Suggested goal: Aim to save one-third of four years of college tuition.
- 2. 529 College Savings Plan
- What is it? A savings account for education expenses with tax benefits.
- Benefits: Money grows tax-free, helping savings accumulate faster.
- 3. Other Tips
- Start early: The sooner you begin saving, the more your money grows.
- Involve family: Relatives can contribute to your child's education fund.

• Automatic savings: Set up automatic transfers to make saving easier.
